The Carillon

Those who built the Paradise SDA Church in the 60's were very forwardfocused when they created a structure that would hold more than twice as many people as the church population at that time. It has served us well for 55 years. This team also commissioned two works of art that reflected their firm conviction that they were living in the last days. The first was a brass hourglass sculpture that was mounted on the wall behind the church platform (where the stained glass window was later installed). The Carillon was the second commission and was part of the original Paradise SDA Church campus. It is rich with symbolism and history. The shape of the carillon tower is symbolic of the Adventist message. It is an image of an hourglass. The large triangular base

represents the vast sands of time that have already passed through the history of the world. The much smaller inverted triangle represents the short amount of time left for the world. Our Advent message has always been centered on the glorious news of the soon return of Jesus. The tower was a special gift by two Paradise members.

The dedication plaque on the Carillon tower reads:

A reminder that we are living in the last days of earth's history is even more significant for us fifty years later. We are blessed that the Carillon survived the fire that took the rest of the church. (Editor's Note: The future of this structure is yet to be determined pending structural evaluation by an engineer.)

From March 21-27, a group of about 21 people came from Walla Walla University and the Gracepoint Church to help those affected by the Camp Fire. "The group was well received. People seemed to be energized by new, smiling faces, and they really appreciated connecting with them, the food they brought, and the hope they conveyed," said Rhonda Bandy, interim NCC disaster response coordinator for the Camp Fire.
